Taxonomy of a circus genre

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Purposes

- To create a **complex classification system** for performing arts, education and **public collections**, i.e. museums, libraries, archives
- To **select**, **record**, **define** and give meaning to traditional and innovative circus terms
- Description of the items collected Creation of specific dictionaries

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Specific dictionaries

Circuses: Capital Circus of Budapest

Events, e.g. festivals

Circus workers: performer, acrobat, acrobat on horseback, untermann, obermann, ringmaster, groom

Persons: Mrs József Picard, Ferenc Picard

Groups: 6 Picard

Requisites: panneu, reins

Animals: horse

Genres: animal acts, equestrian acts, acrobatics, equestrian acrobatics, jockeys, pas-de-deux



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Not just a list of genres - the aim is to create a taxonomic system

Collecting definitions and characteristics

• Several foreign examples, initiatives - comparative analysis, examination of aspects

• Skills

What skills are needed to present the genre?

• Movement types

What elements does the genre consist of?

• Location of the presentation

Where does the performer present the act?

What characteristic feature does the act have?





• Level of risk

How dangerous is the genre to the performer?

Theater, singing, dance, etc.






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II. ANIMAL ACTS All genres involving animals.

A) Animal training

The emphasis is on the performance of the animals and the skills of the trainer. B) Circus acrobatics performed with animals

The emphasis is on the acrobatic performance presented by the performer.

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III. COMEDY

Any genres where the emphasis is on the comic character of the act.

IV. ILLUSION

Any genres that creates illusion, e.g. transformation, object manipulation, imitation.

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Additional needs

Dramatic units

Dramaturgical elements of a complete act which cannot be classified as one of the above genres, e.g. parade, charivari, finale.

Other circus performers

Other actors in the circus show and their performance, e.g. ringmaster, dance group, windjammers.

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- **Details of genre feauters**, e.g.trapeze, double trapeze, triple trapeze, etc.
- Include old, now rare genres
- Relating areas: menagerie, cabaret, side shows, etc.
- **Standardisation of the spelling** of genre terms
- Including and **adapting foreign genres** less known in our country, e.g. daredevil acts
